EDITORIAL.

You will have read about the current proposals for the discharge of charitable donations from the club. As the club has grown in stature and has become more visible in the area it has become necessary to rationalise our approach and to this end the committee is putting forward for comment the following Proposed Mission Statement for Charitable Funding :-

MG Car Club (South Cape)

The Committee of the MG Car Club (South Cape) has been reviewing the use of its surplus funds, and in this regard will be bringing the subject up at the Annual General Meeting in February, 2015, for discussion. The principals for consideration, which have been agreed to at Committee level, are as follows:-

- The primary objective of the MGCC is to promote an interest in the MG marque for the benefit of members. The public profile of the club, however, is higher now than it was a few years ago and it is essential that the club retains a good standing in the community.
- Within the social environment of the Knysna area it is recognized that there are a number of organisations which support worthwhile causes benefitting the community. The MGCC is not a fund-raising organization but would like to support such activities in some manner.
- MGCC has funds for which no specific purposes have currently been defined. It is proposed that the club could make a contribution to these causes by allocating a part of these reserves for use in such projects.
- The fund would be principally available for the provision of materials and equipment to identified projects on a “one-off” basis, rather than support for ongoing administrative costs and services. This would be done wherever possible in conjunction with recognized NGO’s in the area.
- At the 31st December, 2014 The MGCC will have approximately R 90,000 in funds surplus to known requirements. It is proposed that 50% of this amount be placed in a Project Fund for use over a period of three years as outlined above. This would mean that some R 15,000 would be available in each of those years for such activities.

- The projects to be taken up will be identified and approved by the committee, but members are encouraged to make recommendations for consideration, provided they are backed up with suitable motivation and work plans.
- These proposals will not affect the club's ability to distribute to charity any such funds received for which a specific purpose has been defined by the donor. These would include, for example, the money we receive from the organisers of the Knysna Hill Climb and the clubs' share of the surplus that was achieved on the 2014 Indaba.

MAINTAINING THE BREED.

Tony's M-Type restoration progress.

Progress on the 1929 M-Type has been slow but steady!

The chassis was sand blasted and I have sprayed it with 2k black. The differential has got new, tapered roller bearings and a modern lipped seal fitted to the input shaft. All wheel bearings have been replaced and brake shoes re-lined.

The front axle already had new king-pin bushes fitted, so I was able to clean and re-assemble all the road springs, fit them and install the axles.

I had some new plates laser cut in Cape Town for the friction dampers. All four are now assembled, painted and ready for their printed dials to arrive from England before they can be fitted.

When I was in Cape Town collecting the friction damper bits I was delighted to find a pair of suitable headlamps for the car as mine were missing. In the box of bits were two scrap incorrect headlamps but with the correct glass to suit the two I found in Cape Town. However, one has a small crack so I am on the hunt for a replacement.

The wheels went off to Spotless to be bead-blasted and painted. Currently old tyres are fitted just to make the lump a bit more mobile in the garage, but it is still up on it's extended axle stands. Correct tyres will be ordered much later on in the project.

The fuel tank is mounted on the scuttle, above the driver's knees! The original was so badly corroded that Silverton had to make up a replacement. We were able to recover the ends, which have lovely reinforcing flutes pressed into them, so it all has the correct appearance.

The gearbox had been overhauled prior to my getting the car but I had to restore the linkages for the transmission brake that operates on the drive shaft, just behind the gearbox.

Silverton cleaned the radiator but, sadly, it has leaks in numerous places and will have to be re-cored. This is an expensive operation as it is a honeycomb type and the replacement section can only be obtained from one source, so price is high!

Now we have to start with the woodwork for the body. This takes the form of an ash frame, mounted on a marine ply floor. The frame is then clad in thin marine ply and finally gets a vinyl fabric covering!. Mudguards, bonnet and side valences are all steel and these all came with the car.

SAVVA TECHNICAL TIP 91 - Wheel spanners

Have you ever had the experience of trying to remove wheel nuts with the little wheel spanner the manufacturers invariably supply with a car? These spanners may work under perfect conditions - like when the car is brand new, but once you've had new tyres fitted and the wheel nuts tightened by those very special chaps at the tyre shops - add to this a bit of age, dust, rust and rounding off of the nuts - you invariably have no chance of loosening the nuts with the spanner provided. A suggestion is to carry a telescopic or a square wheel spanner. Unfortunately, in recent years, I have had poor results with the square spanners as they seem to be of a very poor quality and invariably only available in metric sizes.

An alternative is a telescopic spanner. They are of excellent quality, 30 cms long extending to 50 cms – so much easier to use. Apart from the added length, the telescopic spanners are much stronger and are slightly offset to clear the wheels rim. They also have a decent rubber grip on the handle. They come supplied with a variety of metric sockets usually from 17 to 23mm, however, as they use a ½ inch drive one can use imperial size sockets suitable for our older cars.

These telescopic wheel spanners are freely available from most accessory shops. The one I'm looking at is made in Germany and sells for R85.00. In addition to using them on wheel nuts they are ideal for heavy work like loosening cylinder head nuts etc.

The photo is a comparison of a closed spanner and an extended one. The black one is typical of one supplied with a Rootes product car (it's a joke).

Conclusion – a worthwhile investment - especially when you're sitting on the side of the road and can't get the wheel nuts loose.
